

### **Paragraph 1 – Introduction (The Wide Scope: Share your name, overall goals, location, livelihood. Keep it conversational, light)**

Example: “Hello, my name is *How They Croaked*. I was written by a woman named Georgia Bragg and I’m a humorous story about how different famous people died. Unfortunately, many could have been prevented if they lived in current times but they met unfortunate ends during their own time. It’s about history, about people, and about science.”

*Direction: Look at the table of contents, chapters, chapter headings, read the first sentences and the conclusion to get the idea of the book. Now, think about how you can introduce the book to someone else*

**Paragraph 2 – Your Basic Goals (List 3-4 goals you’d like to achieve)**

Example: I think we’d be a good match if you enjoy a light read that you don’t have to invest a lot of time in. The short chapters about different famous people and how science could have saved them is fascinating. You’ll be hooked and I think that was Bragg’s intention. She changes it up but also gives you some great understanding about these people.

*Direction: Read the summary of the book on the back or the front or back inside flap. What is the plot of the book? Is the story supposed to be a mystery, suspenseful, scientific, exploratory? What are you supposed to feel?*

**Paragraphs 3 and 4 – All about You (This should be the fun part. Share your favorite words or a motto to live by, what you value in life, what others say about you, what you’re passionate about, what’s on your bucket list and what brings you joy)**

Example: Science is everywhere and the fact that they were able to find out all of these things about famous dead people tens and hundreds of years dead is shocking but interesting. A lot of people who have read the book think that the sketches and the layout of each chapter make it worth the investment.

*Direction: Are there reviews on the book on what others think of the book? What you’re impression of the book from the cover, chapters, organization, facts and information, etc.? What does the book seem to want to share with readers or get them excited about?*

**Paragraph 5 – Those Small Things That Add Up (What else do you want to share?)**


